HOMEMADE STARCH/SIZING RECIPE

“The Redneck Quilter”

- 1) Dissolve 1 teaspoon to 1 tablespoon cornstarch (depending on amount of stiffness you want) in a few tablespoons of cold water in a heat proof 2 cup measuring container.
- 2) Add boiling water to make 1 cup, stirring constantly.
- 3) Then add cold water to the 2 cup line.
- 4) Let cool and use in a spray bottle.
- 5) Shake it every time you spray.
- 6) You may have to dilute it a little if it is too thick or builds up white flakes.
- 7) Discard after a week or so and make a new batch.

I've made this many times and have always been pleased with the results.

Some easy items for busy quilters who still have to make supper!



Chicken Casserole

- 2 sleeves Ritz crackers, smashed**
- 1 stick butter, melted**
- 3 chicken breasts, cooked and cubed**
- 1 (10.75-ounce) can cream of chicken soup**
- 3/4 cup chicken broth**
- 1 (8 -ounce) sour cream**

Preheat oven to 350°. Butter an 8-by-8 inch baking dish..

In a small bowl, mix together crackers and butter, spread half the mixture on the pan. Top with chicken.

In a separate bowl, combine the soup, broth and sour cream. Pour the mixture over the chicken, ensuring that the pieces are evenly coated. Cover with the remaining cracker mixture.

Bake for 40 minutes or until the casserole is hot and bubbly. Serve with rice or noodles.

Day Before Mashed Potatoes

- 2 1/2 lb. potatoes peeled, quartered and cooked**
- 1 (3 oz) pkg. Cream Cheese**
- 1/2 cup sour cream**
- 2 tbsp. butter, or to taste**
- 1/2 tsp. onion powder (or garlic)**
- Salt and pepper to taste**

In a large bowl, mash or whip the potatoes with the cream cheese, sour cream, butter, onion powder, salt and pepper until smooth (add a little milk if necessary). Transfer to a greased 1-1/2 qt baking dish. Bake now or refrigerate and bake next day. Bake uncovered at 350° F for 30 minutes or until heated through.

Slow Cooker Chicken and Dumplings Recipe

Try this great dish. It's so easy & it will amaze your family!

Stir together:

- 1 can cream of celery soup**
- 1 can cream of chicken soup**
- 1 can chicken broth**
- 1 can refrigerated biscuits**
- Chicken pieces**

Seasonings of your choice - garlic, rosemary, etc

Place four to six frozen boneless/skinless chicken breasts/thighs in crock pot.

Pour mixture over chicken breasts; Add pepper & just a touch of salt as the soups have salt added already.

Cook 7-8 hours on LOW (all day) OR 5-6 hours on HIGH; At the last 1/2 hour, add 1 can refrigerator biscuits, torn up into small pieces

***Optional: chopped small onion or small can of mushrooms.**



Overnight Salad

Spread mayonnaise over top of all and sprinkle with sugar to taste. Let set overnight in fridge. Toss before serving.

- 1 head lettuce, chopped**
- 5-6 pieces celery, cut up**
- 1 (15 oz.) pkg. frozen peas, cooked, drained and cooled**
- 1 lg. onion, minced**
- 1 layer bacon, fried, drained and broken up**
- 1 layer shredded cheddar cheese**
