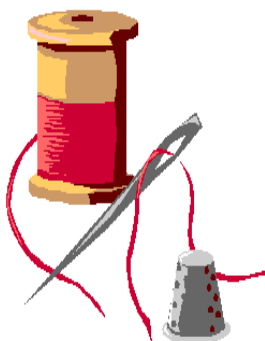

Quilting With Vintage Textiles Workshop

January 9, 2010

A quilt created from squares cut from vintage embroidered items.

You will need:

*embroidered dresser scarves, tablecloths, pillowcases with crocheted edges, etc. (those with stains and holes are fine...) Share them if you wish! Several squares may be cut from one item and traded for variety.

*vintage or reproduction fabrics or feed sacks to frame the squares. Scraps are fine...as long as you can cut 1.5" strips from them. 30's reproductions work well.

Hankie quilt

You will need:

*several hankies...floral, white, crocheted edges, etc. The number depends on the size you have in mind. One for a pillow top, three for a runner, 9 or 12 for a quilt...

*fabric to back the hankies. A white cotton is recommended.

*fabric for sashing, new or vintage.

Whites, creams, and lace crazy quilt ("quilt as you go")

This could be a pillow top, runner, or larger quilt, depending on how many squares you choose to make.

You will need:

* shades of white or ivory damask napkins. They do not need to match. A damask tablecloth would also be fine that you will cut into 12" squares.

* Scraps of vintage edging, laces, doilies, any linen with interesting laces or textures in the shades of whites and creams. Those with holes and stains are fine. For instance, you can cut off the good corner of a stained hankie or the crocheted trim off of a stained pillowcase can be used for embellishing a square.

The NEIQG Board met on Thursday, November 2009, at Gus & Tony's in Waukon. The dinner meeting was called to order at 6:10 PM by President Julie Rotach with the following in attendance: Edna Haskovec, Cheryl Mulder, Marge Johnson, Mary Lou Cotton, Joan Egeland, Linda Monroe, Joni Johnson, Pam Ransom, Sue Lynch, Mary Kay Winke, and Joan Weymiller.

The Secretary and Treasurer's reports will be in the newsletter.

Chairperson Reports:

Publicity: All is going well. We will need to start thinking about publicity for the quilt show.

Historian: Pam wondered if there was enough room to store everything that the guild is storing at Luana and the consensus was yes.

Secretary/Treasurer: Mary Kay Winke was appointed by Julie, the President, to assume the responsibilities of the Secretary for the remainder of the year.

Newsletter: Deadline for items for the newsletter are due December 15, 2009. Edna needs more labels and Mary Lou Cotton will purchase them. The question was raised, should dues cost more to those who choose a hard copy newsletter. The Board decided not.

Librarian: There will be a book sale the month of December, and Linda is suggesting the prices will start at \$5.00 per book.

Program Chairs/Afternoon Chair: The fall retreat was discussed; everyone had a good time. Everything is set for December and January meetings.

Old Business: Christmas stockings will be sewn in the afternoon of the December meeting. They will be mailed overseas and the guild will pay the postage. They do not need to be stuffed.

The names proposed for the 2010 show and guild quilt were discussed. Three names will be chosen and the membership will make the final decision.

Lunch and the large amount of food that is being prepared was discussed. The committee in charge needs to start making less, and we as members need to start eating less. A smaller number of members are coming to the evening meetings. The afternoon meetings are well attended.

The quilt stand fund was discussed and any contributions will be ONLY on a volunteer basis; no names will be recorded as to those who are or have contributed.

New Business: Cancellation information was handed to each member; the President will make the decision and call the area radio stations if NEIQG needs to be canceled due to bad weather.

A motion was made by Mary Lou Cotton that after someone visits two times as a guest he/she will be asked to contribute \$5.00 for attending a meeting or be asked to join the guild. Seconded by Pam Ransom and passed.

Sandi was our October speaker and invited members to make blocks, quilts, Christmas stockings or pillow cases for our troops. Marilyn Barron and Sharon Schmiedel have made 80+ Christmas stockings. Sue Lynch has quilted 2 quilts for them. The guild has the patterns for these projects or you can go to Sandy's web site www.homeofthebravequilts.com. Before and after the afternoon meeting some members got together to work on charity projects. Twenty-four Christmas stockings were made. We may send them on to Sandy's project or perhaps a local interest. We also looked at our raffle quilt and members made some suggestions on how to quilt it. The quilt will be set up at the retreat for members to quilt on it.

*Shell Rock community historical museum will be open Nov. 20-21 during the Shell Rock Bazaar for tours. They will be showcasing old quilts. Any members who have old quilts were invited to put them on display. Call Linda at 319 885-6687.

*Julie Rotach was contacted by someone who wishes to get rid of a quilt frame. If interested, call Julie.

*The New Albin library benefit quilt show was a success. Many members had quilts on display. Thanks to all who participated.

*The guild needs a new secretary to fill out the term until May. Anyone interested please contact Julie. Sue Lynch volunteered to take minutes for the evening.

Officer/Committee Reports:

Treasurer: Mary Lou Cotton gave a treasurer's report and passed out membership cards. A note to members: you need to pay dues by the December meeting or you will not be receiving a newsletter.

Newsletter: Marge Johnson, our editor, wants to know if anyone who has paid dues is not getting a newsletter. We prefer to send them on line, but a hard copy can be mailed for those not set up with e-mail. Any member is able to place an ad in the newsletter; contact Marge for details. December 15 is deadline for items to be in the January newsletter. Contact Marge.

Librarian: Linda Monroe was unable to attend due to surgery. The book sale of under-used books will be held next month.

Vice President: Sue Lynch reported that the community room will be open for charity work in December before and after the afternoon meeting. Guild fabric and some batting will be available for anyone wanting to help or suggest projects. A roll of batting is on order from Hobbs's but has not been shipped yet. We also need help for lunch committees in January, February and April, as only four members have signed up so far. Reminder that everyone is to take his/her turn. Those not signing up will be appointed.

Show Chair: Edna Haskovec reported that October 16-17, 2010, has been reserved for the guild quilt show. It will be held at the Decorah Middle School. This is a change from previous years. We will be able to use the concession area for lunch instead of hiring a kitchen aide. There are many show committees to be set up. Members are encouraged to put their names on one(s) that they prefer. We have 71 disk blades for the quilt frames. Jill Amdahl and Sandy Rethwisch volunteered to help move them to and from a sandblaster so that they can be cleaned up for painting. Quilt frame fund is at \$560. It had been suggested that if every member would consider donating \$20, that this would pay for our own frames. The raffle quilt/quilt show naming vote was tabled until December. Possible names can still be turned in to Julie.

Program: The Program committee announced that the retreat building will open at 7:30. No breakfast is planned for Thurs. morning. Eat on your own before. Classes will start at 10 each day. There will be a trunk show open and free of charge to all at 7 p.m. Thurs. This will be put on by our Friday instructor, Nancy Kazlaukas. The raffle quilt will be set up and members can quilt on it. Mix Up Snack

- 1 box of Crispix
 - 1 bag (14 oz) mini pretzels
 - 3 cans (10 oz each) of nuts, 2 mixed and 1 honey roasted
 - 1 bag (10 oz) chili cheese fritos or doritos
 - 1 bag (10 oz) original corn chips fritos
- Mix in large roaster and cake pan (it makes a lot!).

Melt the following together and pour over the mixture above.

- 1/2 lb butter
- 3 Tbsp honey
- 5 Tbsp brown sugar
- 1 1/2 tsp chili pwd
- 1 1/2 tsp garlic pwd
- 1 1/2 tsp curry pwd
- 1 1/2 tsp celery salt
- 1 tsp onion pwd
- 1 1/2 Tbsp worch. Sauce
- 9-10 drops Tabasco sauce

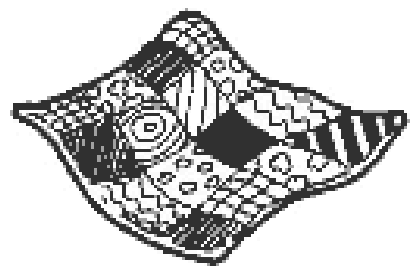
