3. Challenges should be no larger than 24 inches square <u>OR</u> 96 inches total circumference.

Here is a much-requested soup recipe from the January evening meeting.

Cheeseburger Soup

1/2 lb. hamburger
3/4 cup chopped onion
3/4 cup chopped carrots
3/4 cup chopped celery
1 tsp. dried basil
1 tsp. parsley flakes
4 T. butter (divided)
3 cups chicken broth - I used twice this amount-can use bouillon cubes
4 cups diced potatoes
1/4 cup flour
2 cups Velveeta
1 1/2 cups milk
1/4 cup sour cream (optional)
salt and pepper to taste - I didn't use any extra salt since the broth and Veleeta are salty

In a skillet, brown beef, drain and set aside. In same skillet, sauté onion, carrots, celery, basil, and parsley in 1 T. butter until vegetables are tender, about 10 minutes.

Add broth, potatoes, and beef. Bring to a boil, reduce heat, cover, and simmer for 10 to 12 minutes or until potatoes are tender. Meanwhile in a small skillet, melt remaining butter and add flour. Cook and stir for about 3 minutes until bubbly. Add to soup. Bring to boil. Cook and stir for 2 minutes. Reduce heat to "low." Add cheese, milk, and pepper. Cook and stir until cheese melts. Remove from heat. Blend in sour cream if you are including it.


A new column idea ... Where can I find ...? (Share Your Resources)

Chairpersons' Reports:

A Note From Sandi Carstenson ...

Our organization has been requested to supply the Iowa National Guard with homemade Christmas stockings and pillowcases. The total number of troops being deployed will be between 3500 and 4000 troops. We are asking all Iowa Quilt Shops and Quilt Guilds to participate in making these items for the troops. If your shop/guild wishes to participate, please do not mail the stockings/pillowcases until you are provided an address for mailing. You will be mailing them directly to Iraq/Afghanistan. If you ask your guild members to put in 25 cents for each stocking/pillowcase they make, that money will cover the cost of the postage to mail them. Last year our organization provided 14,068 home-made Christmas Stockings and 2000 pillowcases to the troops. We anticipate that number to be even larger for 2010 (we already have 6 requests not counting the Iowa National Guard)!

Candace Arp is sharing the following

Almond Tea

2 1/2 c water

1 c sugar

Bring to a boil. Remove from heat and add 4-6 tea bags and steep for 5 minutes. Remove tea bags. Add:

1/2 c lemon juice (Real Lemon is good)

Concentrate may be stored in refrigerator until needed for company or made cup by cup.

Before serving add:

2 quarts water

1 tsp vanilla

1-3 tsp. almond extract

Mary Kay Winke sent in the following recipe ...

Granola

1 lb rolled oats (old-fashioned, small package)

1/2 cup honey

1 cup chopped almonds, peanuts or any nuts of choice

1 cup wheat germ

1/2 cup brown sugar

1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups raisins, cranraisins, or other assorted dried fruit $\frac{1}{2}$ cup water

I cup hulled sunflower seeds

2 tsp's vanilla

In a large bowl, mix all of the dry ingredients except sugar. In a microwave able bowl, mix the wet ingredients and heat to just below boiling. Stir in and dissolve sugar. Add the wet ingredients to the dry. Mix well and spread on a well-oiled cookie sheet. Bake at 325 degrees for 20-25 minutes; stir several times. At the end, pat firmly to dry. I let this stay in the oven with the door ajar to dry. You can also add M&M's. Very good.
