All you do is sew it together (you provide the batting, which our guild has) and you send back the finished quilt. The Quilts for Kids organization then gives the quilts to children in hospitals. The Christmas stocking project has started out with a bang. Members joined in a work session before and between the April meetings. A total of 108 stockings were completed and are being delivered to Sandy Carstensen, Home of the Brave coordinator. Many others are in various stages of completion. We will be having another work session starting at noon on May 4 in Luana. We will stop for the afternoon meeting and continue working until the evening meeting. Each stocking takes a fat quarter, which makes the front and back, one layer of batting, and 2 layers of a lining. We have been using some discarded motel sheets for the linings. The cuff and a ribbon are added to complete the stocking. We have used a 9 x 18 piece of fabric folded in half or a piece of batting, fleece or felt cut 4 1/2 x width of the stocking plus seam allowance for cuffs. Directions for completing stockings can be found online at www.homeofthebravequilts.com. Patterns can be gotten from Sue Lynch or one of several other members. We welcome donations of supplies and help in completing stockings. Come and join us in making Christmas a little more special for our Troops.

Directions to the August Garden Party Meeting At Joni Johnson's

From Decorah: East on Hwy. 9 to the second Oil Well Road (almost to the Frankville turn). Go left on to Oil Well Road approx. 1/2 mi to the first T intersection, Norske Rd. Go right on Norske Rd. approx. 1/2 mi. to 1479 Norske Rd. Take a right into our driveway. Our driveway is approx. 1/2 mi. to our house.

From Waukon: Go west on Hwy. 9 to the first road on right after the Frankville turn, Oil Well Road. Turn right on Oil Well Road approx. 1/2 mi. to the first T intersection, Norske Rd. Go right on Norske Rd. approx. 1/2 mi to 1479 Norske Rd. Take a right into our driveway. Our driveway is approx. 1/2 mi. to our home.

If coming through Frankville, go east on Hwy 9 for a very short distance to the first road on the right, Oil Well Road. Follow above directions.

The program will be the garden and all of the garden-related quilts you bring. I encourage everyone to bring at least one garden-related quilt to share. If possible, please bring your own chair. I have some but not enough for everyone. Park off to the side along the driveway. Please leave the closer spots for those who have trouble walking. Pray for a nice day!!! Show 2010 Nametag Directions

To construct a shoofly block using your scraps you will need the following.

- 4 dark 1½ inch squares
- 2 dark 1 7/8 inch squares
- 2 light 1 7/8 inch squares
- 1 light 11/2 x 31/2 rectangle

Make 4 half square triangles from the light and dark squares by doing the following.

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the light squares. Sandwich one light and one dark square. Stitch ¼ inch from the line on each side. Cut on the diagonal line. Press open with your seam going to the dark side. Resize to 1 ½ inches. You will have 4 half square triangles.

Construct the block to look like the shoofly block pattern by placing a light square in the center of your block so that you can write NEIQG 2010 on that center square.

Add the 1½ x 3½ rectangle to the bottom of the block. Write your name on the rectangle using any method you prefer such as pigma pen, sharpie, embroidery, etc.

Finish as desired.


