Quilt Show Quarterly

The days are getting shorter; nights cooler and a year from now we will be frantically piecing, quilting, and binding projects for the 2020 quilt show. Preparations are already well underway; committees are forming up nicely (Thank you to all of our volunteer committee chairs and co-chairs.) and the raffle quilt is being pieced. Please bring in all of the completed raffle quilt blocks and any unfinished ones by the September 3rd meeting. The Raffle Quilt Committee will be assembling the quilt top in late September. With a bit of luck it will be ready to show at the October 1st meeting. We will be naming the quilt and show at the November 5th meeting.

There has been quite a lot of discussion about judging quilts for the next show. At the September meeting we will vote by paper ballot. The board and co-chairs have pared down the choices to three options. Each choice has merit. In choice number one there would be no judging prior to the show. However, we would still have viewer's choice on both days with at least 2 categories; large and small quilts as we have been done in the past. Choice number two also means that we would not have a judged show, but we could hire a 4-H quilt judge or other textile expert to critique quilts for piecing, quilting, color selection, thread work, etc. This would take place one to two months prior to the show and could be our July program. The third choice is to have a judged show with an AQS certified judge. This is similar to what we have had in the past. There is one major change. The judging would take place about one to two months ahead of the show and you would have to be responsible for

getting your judged quilt to the show. This is a one-time change in our quilt show format.

Please select one of the following choices:
1. Do not judge quilts for the 2020 show. (Just skip this one time.)
2. Have a quilt evaluator critique the show quilts one to two months prior to the show. (There will be a small fee for the critique and no show ribbons will be awarded.)
3. Have an AQS judge the show quilts one to two months ahead of the show date. (This is the most expensive option; quild participants must pay a fee.)

Something to consider: It is never too early to think about and make Canister Raffle items. Mary S. and Pat B. are our chairpersons and would be happy to start collecting your quilt related prizes for next year's show.



The Farmer's Daughters Retreat Center has a 2000 sq. ft. classroom equipped with comfy roller chairs, large ironing boards, design wall, cutting tables and work-stations and is adjacent to her quilt shop. Twin beds covered with handmade quilts and pillowcases are grouped 2 - 4 in a room with bathrooms adjacent. Bed linens and towels are provided along with basic kitchen supplies. There are 5 twin beds in a handicap accessible room on the first floor. We are planning a potluck salad bar for lunch on Friday. Breakfast will be provided both mornings; pizza will be ordered for lunch on Saturday and we will eat out for the evening meals. There is room for each of us to bring snacks. Coffee, tea, milk and water will also be available.

We may begin to arrive at 10:00 am on Friday and we must be checked out by 3:00 pm on Sunday.

The retreat center charges a flat fee of \$100 per person for the entire weekend so we will not break down the costs on a per day basis. There is a meal fee of \$20.00 for the 2 breakfasts and pizza lunch. Supper costs are your responsibility.

There are no scheduled classes so bring your own projects to finish. If you have a tip or trick to share we will have a sharing and show and tell time each evening. You may also bring magazines or patterns to share or swap.

8-13-19 NEIQG Board Meeting

President Lori Heitman called the board meeting to order at the Luana Tap on August 13, 2019. Present: Lori Heitman, Melodye Protsman, Julie Rotach, Carol Maki, Ila Benzing, Roberta Hass, Marty Berda, Cindy Berns. Absent: Leslie Sand, Marge Johnson, Nancy Sojka.

Minutes of the 5-21-19 board meeting were previously approved and reported in the newsletter. Treasurer's balance after the August workshop bill is just over \$11,000.

Lori reported that the trailer license plate notice comes to her and then Leslie pays it and the tags go to Arlene who has the trailer stored. The notices for Network also will be coming to Lori as president and then shared with program persons.

Clarification reviewed for guild year: fiscal year for tax reporting is Jan. 1-Dec. 31. The guild program year runs June 1-May 31 with dues payment corresponding with the program year (payable in June). Annual meeting remains in May.

Lunch committee sign up will continue at the Sept. afternoon and evening meetings with members not signed up being assigned after the Sept. meetings. Members who served last year will not serve again this year. Ila and Roberta updated info on the bus trip to Madison and the Nov. retreat. There are still spots open on the bus, contact Ila or Roberta. Bus leaves Decorah at 6:00 am, Waukon at 6:30 am, and arrives at Prairie du Chien at 7:00 am with departure scheduled for 7:15 am; Culver's stop for supper will be at approx. 5:00 pm. Retreat costs will be honored by the new owner at LouAnn's in Oelwein and registration and payment will continue at the Sept. meetings.

Review and updating of officer job descriptions, by-laws, handbook, and guild time-line was begun and will be continued at the next board meeting. Officers are updating their officer folders/totes and will ask members to bring any guild information or papers they may have at home to be included in the officer packets.

Marty Berda and Cindy Berns reported on the quilt show plans. Blocks being sewn by members are to be turned in at the Sept. meetings. Fat quarters can still be donated. The raffle quilt committee will be assembling the top in Sept. Marty moved to have a vote in Sept. by paper ballot at both afternoon and evening meetings to decide on having the quilt show judged or not (moved to Sept. from Aug. due to day workshop in Aug. and no afternoon session); Roberta seconded; motion carried.

Next scheduled board meeting is Thursday, Nov. 14 at $6:00~\mathrm{pm}$ at the Luana Tap.

Sue Lynch moved to adjourn, Reva Prestemon seconded; carried.
