NEIQG Board Meeting Minutes 1-10-23

Board Meeting - 1-10-23 @ 5:45 in person at the Library in Monona and via Zoom/phone call. Board members present: President Ila Benzing, Treas. Roberta Hass, Sec. Martha Bartenhagen, Historian Carol Maki, Program Nancy Sojka, Show Ch. Marty Berda, Show Ch. Jen Hertrampf, Zoom facilitator Arlene Klatt, Marlene Gould, owner of Quilted Strawberry and President of Manchester Quilt guild.

Secretary's minutes - Martha will send the October board minutes and board will vote on them.

Treasurer's report - Bert Hass emailed her January Treasurer's report and it was approved at the January guild meeting.

Old business:

- Quilt Show report: Discussion on the venue of the last quilt show; \$600 per day for the venue of the Winneshiek County Fairgrounds, the fair board needs to address internet issues. Lynnette Rose will be the contact/fair board member. We need to decide soon so the show is listed in the tourism calendars.
- Charity/40th year Guild challenge: Bert says she's had 172 pillowcases turned in. She still has kits for members to pick up and sew.

New business:

- Ila Benzing requested opinions on the guild contributing to Iowa Quilt Museum, Wisconsin Public Television, and Iowa Public Television. Martha Bartenhagen made a motion to recommend to the general body that the guild give each entity \$100, Carol Maki seconded; motion passed.
- Discussion was held for payment of presenters- especially guild members or presenters that don't have a set fee. Bert Hass made a motion that \$75 for the evening meeting and mileage will be paid to the December program presenter; Marty Berda seconded; motion passed.
- Bert Hass made a motion that guild members as program presenters would be paid \$75 per afternoon meeting, \$75 per evening meeting, and a meal as policy; the presenter or guild will set the workshop fee on a case-by-case basis; Martha Bartenhagen seconded; motion passed. The board held discussion about outside presenters in regard to payments for programs, workshops, mileage, meals, and lodging.
- We have 12 signed up for Spring retreat and there is room for 16 to attend at the Camp EWALU Stone Center (north of Strawberry Point) on April 14, 15, & 16 Starting at 9 AM with the cost of \$100 per person to guarantee your spot.
- Bert Hass made a motion that the guild give Mike Ellingsen a \$100 check to reimburse him for backing and batting materials used on the Friendship Blocks quilt given to President Ila Benzing; Marty Berda seconded; motion carried.
- Jen Hertrampf will be calling for members to serve on the committee for the new raffle quilt selection for the 2024 raffle quilt.
- The February Cherrywood workshop (\$30) will be held 10 am 1 pm via Zoom. Jess, of Red Roxy Quilt Co. has offered Red's Retreat Center in Decorah, if you would rather attend away from your home (additional \$25).
- Discussion was held on the various NorthEast Iowa Quilters' Guild logos and members are encouraged to display it on communications.
- The February 11th Charity Sew Day will be held from 9am 3 pm at One Block Over Quilt Shop in West Union (322 E Main Street) in the upstairs sewing area. For lunch, a salad buffet will be held; please bring items to share on a salad bar.
- Ila Benzing announced the guild will be assembling a nominating committee to get officers for the coming year. The Slate of officers for election will be for the President position, Historian, Show Co-chair, and Program position. Ila will get a guild member to work with Martha Bartenhagen on the nominating committee.
- Marlene Gould, owner of Quilted Strawberry and the President of the Manchester Quilt guild attended the board
 meeting to discuss possible solutions to some damage on the NEIQguild's quilt show yard signs. Bert Hass moved that
 NEIQG would reimburse the \$100 deposit and the Manchester Quilt guild would pay for new signs for NEIQG and

The NorthEast Iowa Quilters' Guild met on February 7, 2023 via Zoom at 7:00 pm. Approximately 23 people attended via Zoom.

The night's program was Karla Overland, Colorist, Dyer, Designer, and Owner of Cherrywood Hand Dyed Fabrics in Baxter, MN. She led us on a tour of the history of Cherrywood and her current activities and challenge projects. Cherrywood Fabrics was created over 30 years ago by Dawn Hall, who started dyeing fabric in her kitchen and selling at quilt shows with her aunt. Cherrywood has perfected the rich, suede look of this gorgeous fabric that can be used in quilts, garments, home decorating, and anywhere else you want a solid color that doesn't just look flat. The team currently hand-dyes over a thousand yards of fabric a week. Cherrywood sponsors an art contest using their fabrics. There is still time to enter this year's competition of the Monarch Challenge!

President Ila Benzing opened the meeting with a welcome to members and guests. All viewers were invited to show Karla any projects in which they used Cherrywood fabrics.
