"Are any of these quilts for sale?" That is a very common question that we have at our quilt shows. So let's take this question and do some good with it.

I would like to challenge each one of our members to make at least one guilt project. It will be hung at the show for sale with a price put on the project along with the charity of your choice where the money that is paid will go. The people that purchase the guilts will write the check directly to the charity you pick.

Example: A twin size quilt is made and a price of \$200 is put on it. During the quilt show, the quilt is hung up in a special display area. The person writes the check directly to the charity of your choice like Camp Ewalu.

If a person stops and says I love that quilt but can only afford to pay \$150 instead of \$200, their name can be taken down and they can be contracted at the end of the show to see if they are still interested if the quilt doesn't sell for the registered amount. We will check with the maker before we OK the lower price.

Please have the guilts finished by September 1, 2024. We will take a picture of the guilt and send it to the charity of your choice. They will then be able to show it on their website and promote our quilt

NEIQG Board Meeting Sun, Sept 17 5 pm Zoom

Members attending: Arlene, Lynette, Jen, Roberta, Sue, Melodye, Roxie

Pillowcase Challenge: Count is approx. 412, may have a few more come in yet but are just waiting to distribute. The challenge is completed.

President's Challenge: Lynette asked if we should make and donate or have them at the quilt show first, then sell? Agreed to have at the guilt show. Lynette will send out more information on this challenge.

T-shirt orders: \$354 was turned in at the last meeting for t-shirt orders. We needed a minimum of 10 shirts to order and had way more than that. There is still time to order at the Oct. meeting. Talked about possibly doing another round of ordering in May so that new members or others may wish they had ordered when they see them. They would like them to be worn at the quilt show.

Quilt for the quilt show: coming along well, working on borders. Sue shared a picture of it so far; it's beautiful. As soon as finished it will be sent out for quilting bids.

Mike E has mentioned he would consider taking over the entries for the quilt show if need be. We discussed the menu for the quilt show. Last time we tried bars, but pies went better so we will stick to pie. We will keep the menu the same otherwise. Will not get pop from the fair board as many commented they'd rather have smaller amounts in cans instead of bottles.

Bus Trip: Went well; Roxie didn't lose anyone. We had \$25 paid in cash for parking, \$50 in door prize cash to spend at participating booths, and a check was written to the bus company for \$1675.

Surveys: A new guild was started by two of our current members. Lynette wished they had come and talked to her first instead of finding out on social media and print. It had been discussed between the meetings last month to find other meeting towns and move the meetings around to generate more interest. Arlene mentioned it was talked about at the last meeting with some as she was in on the conversation. Wasn't intended to go behind anyone's back and not actually called a "new guild" but a gathering. There was a lot of discussion on all the topics in the survey, especially the snacks and demos between meetings. A google drive doc will be created with demo ideas on it that members can sign up for or put down other suggestions. These are to be 15-20 demos, not a workshop or needing supplies for members.
